ACUM Breaks Ground for New Headquarters

The leadership of the newly organized Atlantic Caribbean Union Mission (ACUM) broke ground for the construction of their headquarters at Bethany





Cove, Westridge Estates in Nassau, Bahamas. The ceremony to mark this historic occasion took place on Sunday, January 16, 2011.

According to the chief architect of the building, Lionel Johnson Jr., the three-story building, which will be located opposite the Bethany Seventh-day Adventist Church, will occupy approx mately 5,500 sq. ft. and is designed to fit into the Bahamian Islands context while also proclaiming the presence of the Seventh-day Ad-

"It is a blend of traditional vernacular styles with an infusion of classical elements," said Johnson. "It is designed to be both visible and recognizable as a symbol of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in The Bahamas." The building, which is expected to cost approximately US\$700,000.00, would have

been far more expensive if it were not for the many members who have so far given their support with time, talent, and financial re-

"It is amazing to see the number of members who have volunteered and have committed to give support to the construction of our headquarters," said Pastor Leonard Johnson, President of ACUM. "I express deep gratitude to those who came to assist us voluntarily even when we did not ask them to. This tells me that the true Spirit of Christ is still at work in the hearts and minds of individuals who see the need to build up God's kingdom." Said Johnson, "As young persons in the Seventhday Adventist Church we long for opportunities to be of service to a church that we owe so much to. Hence when such an opportunity arose, it was with a feeling of humility and yet trepidation that the design work on the New Atlantic Caribbean Union Mission Building began with input from the Union, Bethany Church members, builders, and Adrian Rollins."

Pastor Israel Leito, President of the Inter-American Division of Seventh-day Adventists, who did the devotion at the ceremony challenged the leadership of the Union to finish the new building in time for the Division's year-end meetings scheduled for October 31 - November 3, 2011 in Nassau, Bahamas.

Inter-American Division officials along with Union, Conference, Field and Institution officials, and local church leaders participated in the groundbreaking exercise which was directed by Pastor Leonard Johnson.


